College Admission Case Studies Night and College Fair, April 5th from 6-8:00PM



ALA Girls State is a unique and exciting government-inaction learning program in which ALA members guide young women



to become patriotic, knowledgeable stewards of freedom and democracy.

WHAT IS ALA GIRLS STATE?

The American Legion Auxiliary Girls State program, first presented in the late 1930s, is one of the most respected experiential learning programs in the United States. Guided by the principle "For God and Country," the program



epitomizes the ALA's mission to honor those who have brought us our freedom by continuing to train young women to be leaders grounded in patriotism and Americanism. ALA Girls State participants become extremely knowledgeable about the democratic process and how our republic works at the state and national levels.

About 16,000 young women participate in weeklong ALA Girls State programs across the nation each summer. Though each Girls State is unique in its operation, each session adheres to the same basic concept: teaching government from the township to the state level. Using a nonpartisan curriculum, participants assume the roles of government leaders, campaigning as "Federalists" and "Nationalists" to become elected officials in their mock ALA Girls States. During the immersive-learning program, delegates live in "cities" within a dormitory on a college or university campus. The knowledge, memories, and friendships they take home last a lifetime.


To be eligible, young women must:

American Legion Boys State is among the most respected and selective educational programs of government instruction for high school students in the nation. At Boys State, young men are exposed to the rights and privileges, the duties, and responsibilities of a franchised citizen. The training is objective, nonpartisan, and practical with city, county and state governments operated by elected and appointed officials duly placed in office by their fellow citizens of Boys State.

American Legion Boys State has been a national program since 1935 and Colorado Boys State has been conducted since 1949. Every year more than 20,000 boys participate in American Legion Boys State program.

ALA GIRLS STATE SELECTION AND APPLICATION PROCESS

ALA Girls State delegates are a diverse group of young women with a shared desire to learn and lead. Girls State "citizens" come together from small towns, big cities, and rural areas to hold Girls State elections, and their varied backgrounds set the stage for a week of spirited, experiential learning.

American Legion Auxiliary units work with local high school educators to identify girls who have demonstrated leadership qualities. Eligible female students are then recommended and selected by sponsoring American Legion Auxiliary units. Female delegates to ALA Girls State programs must have completed their junior year in high school and have at least one semester remaining. Each ALA Girls State program and/or ALA unit determines the process they will use to select the delegates for their state, and those decisions are final. The number of ALA Girls State citizens varies by state and is determined by each state's American Legion Auxiliary resources.

Female high school juniors interested in applying to attend ALA Girls State are encouraged to contact their school counselor or their local American Legion Auxiliary units regarding the application process and deadline.

COST

The costs of ALA Girls State programs are underwritten by each state-level American Legion Auxilliary, Girls State delegates' registration fees are paid for by the sponsoring local

Link Crew Leadership Group



The Optional **SAT** with Essay in Colorado

11th-grade public school students in Colorado can add the SAT* with Essay to their SAT School Day registration for free. The Colorado Department of Education will cover all fees so you can take the SAT with Essay during the school day on April 12, 2023.

About the SAT with Essay

- The SAT with Essay will take approximately one hour longer than the SAT.
- It's your choice. You decide whether or not to take the SAT with Essay.
- The SAT Essay is scored separately from the SAT and does not impact your Evidence-Based Reading and Writing score.

Why Take the SAT with Essay?

The SAT Essay lets you practice your skills and gives you a chance to show colleges that you're ready for college-level writing assignments.

It's About the Real World

The SAT with Essay is a lot like a typical college writing assignment that asks you to analyze a text. It shows colleges you're ready to get to campus and write.

You'll have 50 minutes to:

- Read a passage
- · Explain how the author builds an argument to persuade an audience
- Support your explanation with evidence from the passage

Register for the SAT with Essay

You can take the SAT with Essay at no additional cost. You must register between January 17 and February 16, 2023.



Parking Permit Reminder

Fossil Ridge High School Students and Parents,

This is a friendly reminder that Fossil Ridge High School (FRHS) requires all students and staff parking on campus to display a valid parking permit. This practice is standard across all six of Poudre School District's comprehensive high schools.



Currently FRHS provides parking permits to students for a one-time fee of \$25. For security purposes it is important for administrative and security staff to know who is parked on our campus whether student, staff, parent, or visitor. The best way for us to accomplish our goal is to have a comprehensive parking program that helps to identify these vehicles.

Parking permits can be obtained by filling out an application from the East Wing Office at FRHS. Students will be required to show **proof of payment, a valid driver's license, vehicle registration, and insurance** specific to their vehicle(s) prior to obtaining their hang tag permit.

It is important to know that failure to obtain a parking permit and/or failure to follow parking rules may result in violations/warnings and the possibility of parking privileges on PSD property being temporarily or permanently suspended. Vehicles with multiple violations or more than two warnings for failure to obtain or display a valid parking permit may be "booted" using an immobilization device until appropriate permit registration is complete.
