About 20 remaining on wait list.  -11 student increase, but cuts are still necessitated due to decreased carry-over (reduced from 10% to 3%)  -Budget cuts are determined by values set by administrative team and department leaders (staff over stuff, etc.)  -Total Cuts for 2024-2025: \$537,000. These are substantiated in the following areas: -3.25 FTE (retirees not backfilled: Math, Language Arts, Art) -1 student monitor position -Reduction of \$50,000 in operating costs -Fee offset of \$72,140
